Amiracle4sure's mission is to improve the quality of life for individuals and their families whose lives have been impacted by negative life experiences; and to provide education, mentoring and advocacy for individuals and their children as they successfully transform their lives after incarceration. Research is clear, domestic violence perpetrated against Black victims leads, often, to incarceration. An opportunity to impact Black victims of domestic violence when most needed may lie at the intersection of release from incarceration and domestic violence victimization. It is often at this point where Black victims of domestic violence are most alone and at risk of returning to domestic abuse or recovering from the trauma of a lifetime of abuse.
